

Ethical evaluation

The ethical evaluation of articles is carried out in a two-tier process:

1. Editorial ethics - coordinated in which are analysed:
 - a. suspicions of plagiarism,
 - b. improper declaration of authorship (mentioning authors who did not contribute to the research or writing of the text and excluding contributing authors).

If it is determined that the author infringes the principles of editorial ethics, the article will be rejected and the author will no longer be allowed to publish in Polis. In this case, the editorial office will inform the author of the reason for rejection.

2. **Research ethics** - coordinated within which the ethical rules of scientific research are followed (confidentiality of personal data, obtaining the consent of the person/persons interviewed in the research, protection of the interests of individuals or legal entities, in order not to violate their image or other rights provided by law).

If the author is identified as infringing the principles of research ethics, the article will be returned to the author for correction of these deficiencies. If the deficiencies cannot be remedied within one week, the article will be rejected.
